The members of graveyard association met at their graveyard on September 9<sup>th</sup> 1893 to survey and lay out <sup>remaining</sup> lots on said graveyard and assign one lot to each member of said association; also to organize and elect a board of Trustees consisting of a Superintendent and a Secretary and Treasurer - Mr Henry Kayser was elected Superintendent -

Mr G. K. Marx was elected Secretary  
 Mr Gerhard Basen was elected Treasurer  
 next it was agreed on to leave a five-way of forty feet (40') running north and south through center of said graveyard also one five-way of forty feet (40') wide running through center of said graveyard east and west commencing on west line of graveyard ending on west line of lot one -

lots on East half of said graveyard where laid out to wit: commencing on east end north line strips of twelve feet ~~12~~ inches (12'-4") wide running north and south beginning with lot one on east line assigned to Fred Koern

the south part of west half was not laid out Mr S. A. Smith claims a square lot on north East corner of said south part of west half. and Mr Frank Silfies claims <sup>Lot 3-24-8" N.W. section</sup> west lot of said south part of west half 24 feet and eight inches wide.

The fixing up of fence was left by the board to Joseph Harper for seven Dollars and fifty Cents as payment in full for north half of lot nine and south half of lot eight (8).

there was received four Dollars and sixty cents \$4.60 from Henry Kieselhorn as Bal. due on lot five (5) there was also received by Treasurer three Dollars and seventy five cts. from Casper Dossie being payment in full for north half of lot eight (8).
